Thomas Adams

Scientist 1818 -1905

After failing to make rubber tyres using a Mexican chewing plant called chicle, he added sugar and created Chiclets chewing gum, still available today except in Singapore where it is banned.



Osama Bin Laden

Activist 1957-

Established the business management model described as 'centralisation of decision and decentralisation of execution' in contrast to contemporary 'command and control'.

Vincenz Czerny


Surgeon 1842 - 1916
Performed the first breast implant operation. Without him there would be no Katie Price (Jordan) who stood in the 2001 general election promising free breast implants. She got 713 votes.

Disney

Walt Disney

Film maker 1901 - 1966

An innovator of animation and entrepreneur who developed the earliest superbrands by exploiting his iconic cartoon chracters.



Robert Edwards

Physiologist 1925 -

Along with Patrick Steptoe, they pioneered IVF leading to the birth of the world's first test-tube baby Louise Brown in 1978.

Richard Douglas Fosbury

Athlete 1947 -

Revolutionized the high jump using a back-first technique, winning gold at the 1968 Olympics. This technique is now called the Fosbury Flop.



Francis Galton

Polymath 1822 - 1911

Half-cousin of Darwin, a pioneer of eugenics, he coining the expression "nature vs nurture". Devised a system for classifying fingerprints useful in forensics.

HEFNE

Hugh Marston Hefner

Publisher 1926 -

Playboy founder and chief creative officer. Commercialised soft porn.



Harold LeClair Ickes

Administrator, politician 1874 - 1952 Responsible for implementing Roosevelt's 'New Deal', creating growth in the US economy following the 'Great Depression'.



Media tycoon 1947 -

Brought 'reality' to our screens in the guise of Big Brother.

NISSen

George P. Nissen

Gymnast, inventor, 1914 - 2010 Created the trampoline.

Charles Officer

Scientist 1940 -

Coined the phrase 'plate tectonics' to explain the concept of continental drift, ridiculed when first proposed in 1912 by Alfred Wegener.

Randolph Severn Parker III

Animator, screenwriter 1969 -

Together with Matt Stone, 'Trey' created South Park, 'politically incorrect and shockingly profane' yet hugely successful.



Mary Quant

Fashion designer 1934 - 2010



Bernard Silver


Scientist d1963

Embryologist 1944 -

He led the team that in 1996 created the first cloned mammal from an adult cell – Dolly, a Finnish Dorset lamb.



Malcolm Little aka El-Hajj Malik El-Shabazz

Political activist 1925 - 1965

Advocate for the rights of African Americans, indicted white America for its crimes against black Americans. Detractors accused him of racism, black supremacy, antisemitism, and violence.

Muhammad Yunus

Banker, econmist 1940 -

Developed the financial innovation of microcredit – very small loans to those in poverty to spur entrepreneurship, encourage self-employment and the generation of income-building wealth and exiting poverty.



Niklas Zennström

Entrepreneur 1966 -

Founder, with Janus Friis, of several high-profile online ventures including Skype, a telephony company based on peer-to-peer principles.
